CIRCLE K HISTORY CORNER

- Two Circle K clubs in Texas were among the first 25 chartered in Circle K International—Howard Payne College, and Lamar School of Technology (Lamar University)
- In December of 1955 the first Texas-Oklahoma constitution and bylaws were adopted
- Circle K clubs have existed at 112 colleges and universities in the Texas-Oklahoma district
- When the Baylor chapter was formed in 1956, a campus rule required all student organizations with affiliations outside of Baylor was to be considered a chapter. This sanction stuck and today all Circle K affiliates are called chapters.
